#### **Quick Review - BIKE-SEAL AUTO-SEAL**

With the spate of punctures we seem to be getting just now I thought it was about time to get myself a kit to be prepared for the next one. Well I did not have to wait long! Just another thousand miles and what looked like a big staple managed to pierce my nearly

new tyre! Ah lets give this a go then.

I had done a bit of research into the kit that I wanted and this kit from Bike-Seal fitted the criteria perfectly with its permanent fix and no speed restrictions to worry about. It all comes in a nice well-made zipped case just big enough for all the contents. Instructions in detail although a little small to read at the roadside if you need to check that you are doing it properly.



You can get the kit with 6 or 12 plugs and with or without the Multi Tool, the tools are a nice size not too small so you can get a good grip on the handles which you need for getting through the tyre in and out!



The plugs look like others I have seen and are TUV tested in Germany up to 186mph with a repair shear strength, up to 160kgs.



The plugs have an 8-10-year shelf life so there shouldn't be a worry about them drying out that I have seen on other brands, I have put them in a sealed pouch though just in case!



## **Quick Review - BIKE-SEAL AUTO-SEAL - continued**

First puncture sorted, I was able to do it without needing the special lube supplied if you cannot get through your rubber er tyre carcase. The blade did take a bit of work to cut off the excess but hey that's a good thing yes?

I have done 2,000 miles so far and there has been no problem with the repair, I have replaced the tyre just now as I needed a fresh tyre





for our Balkans tour but I will put it back on again when I have worn the present tyre out.

the kits are £44-£49 depending on contents and as a member of the IAM you get £2 discount and free Postage from Bike-Seal.

The direct phone number is 01278 671900 and they are very helpful and you can order every part separately as well when or if you need to order a part.
